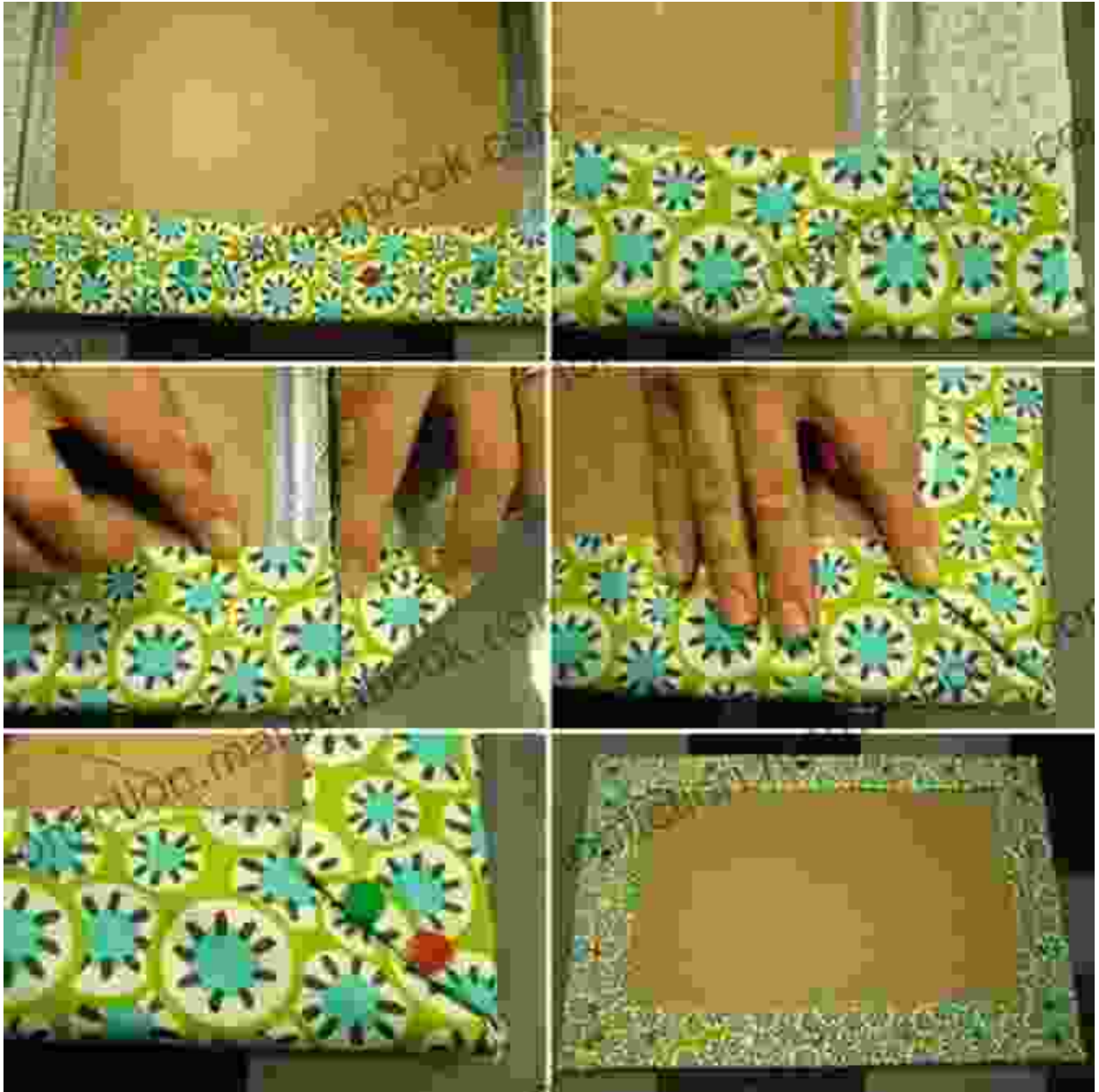


## Cardboard Boxes

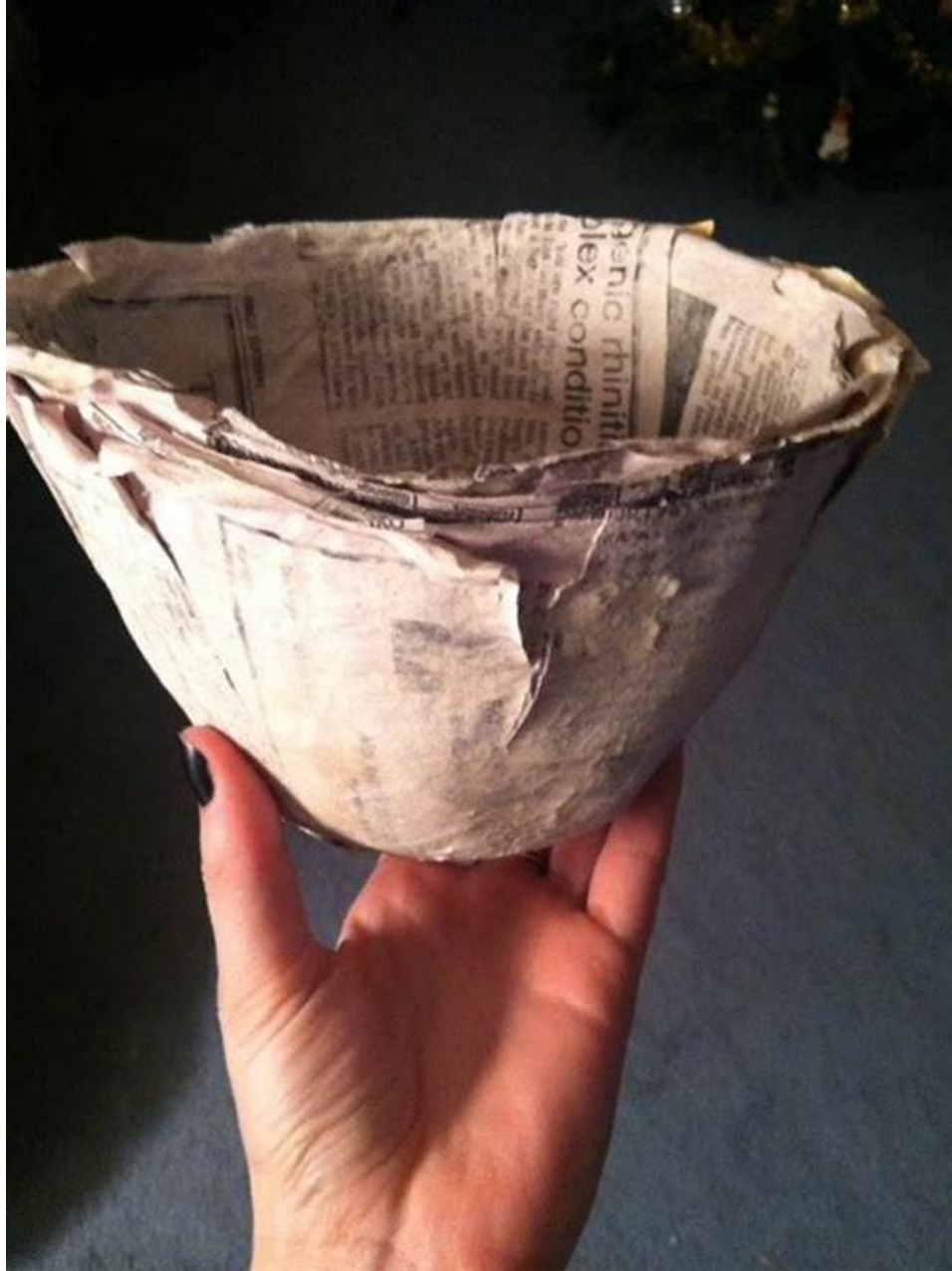

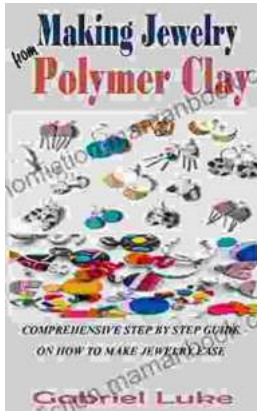
