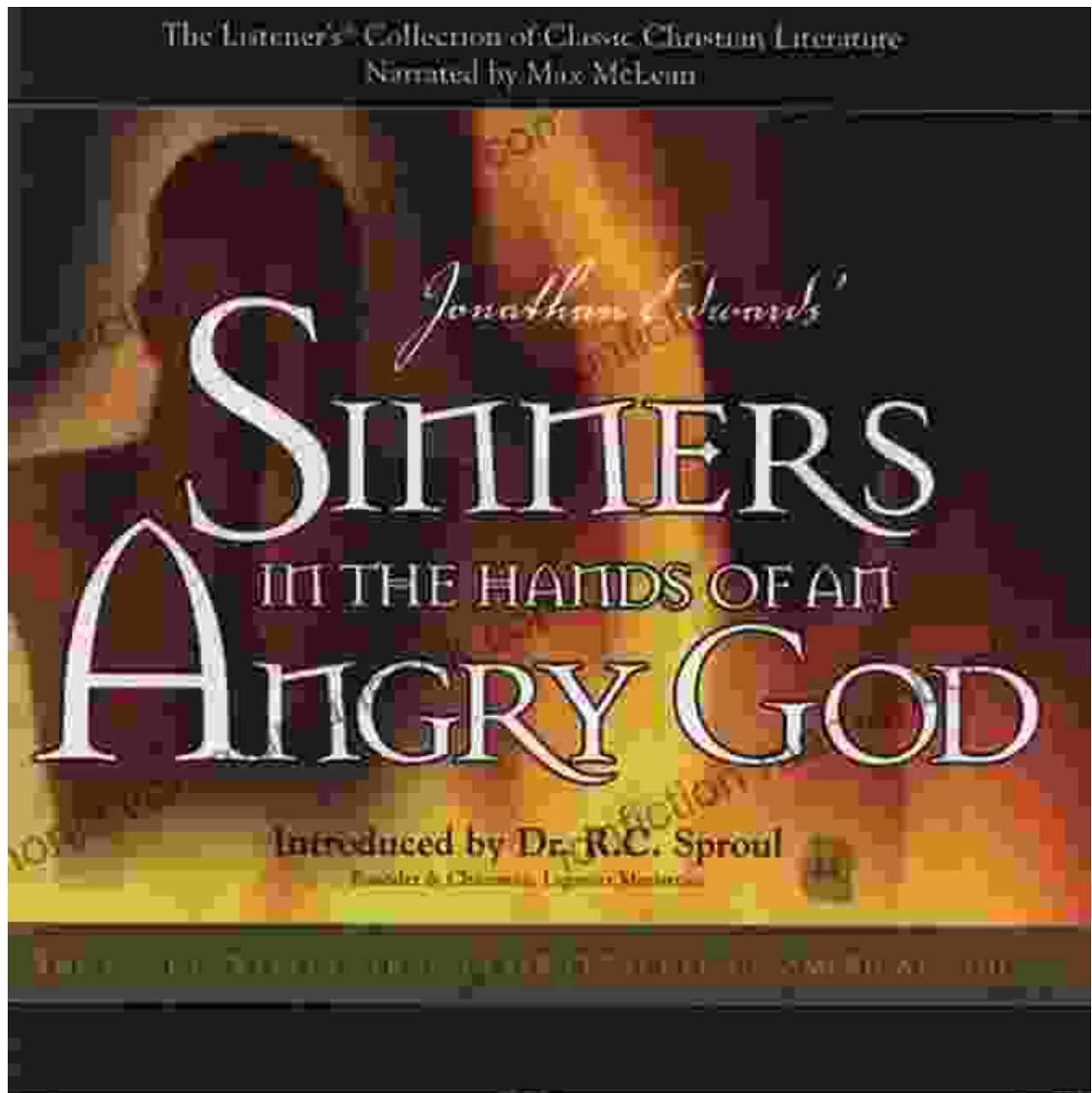

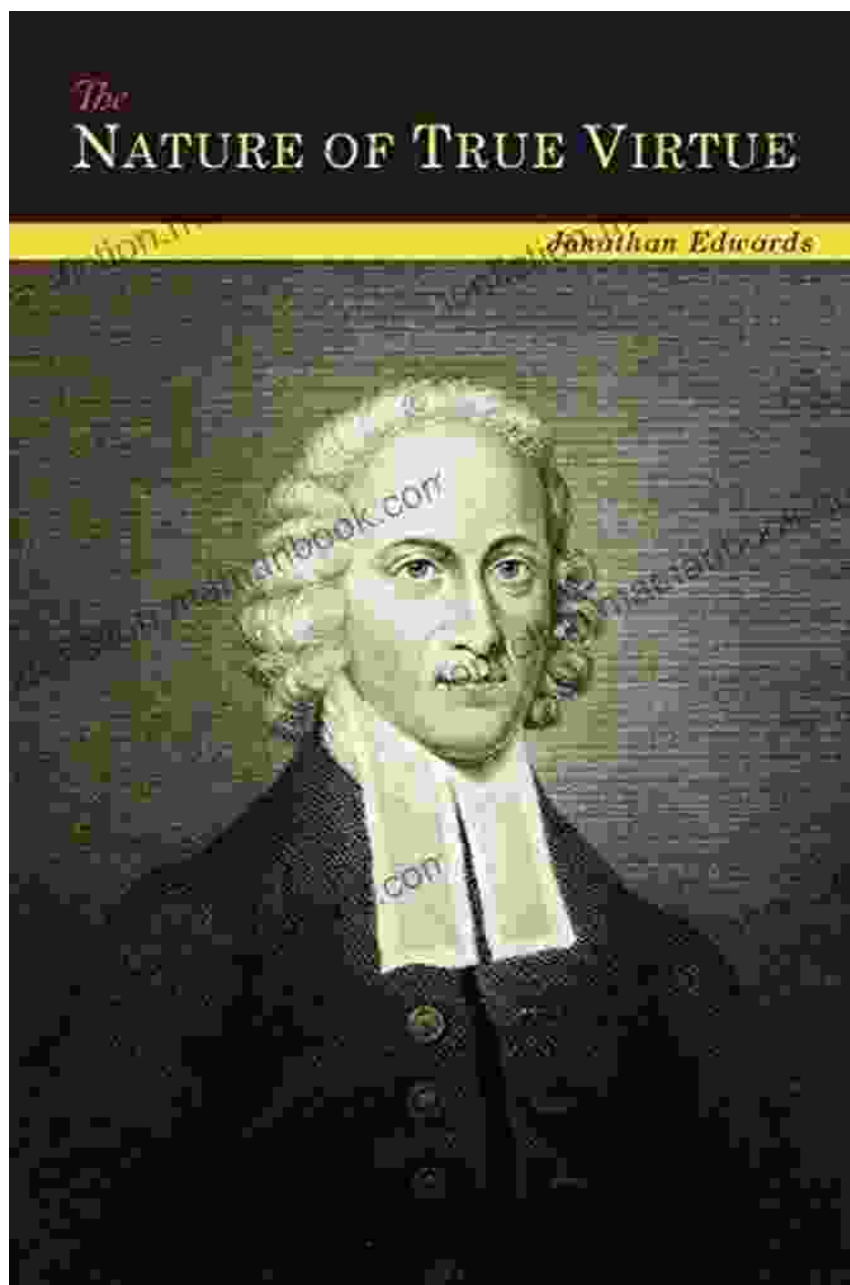

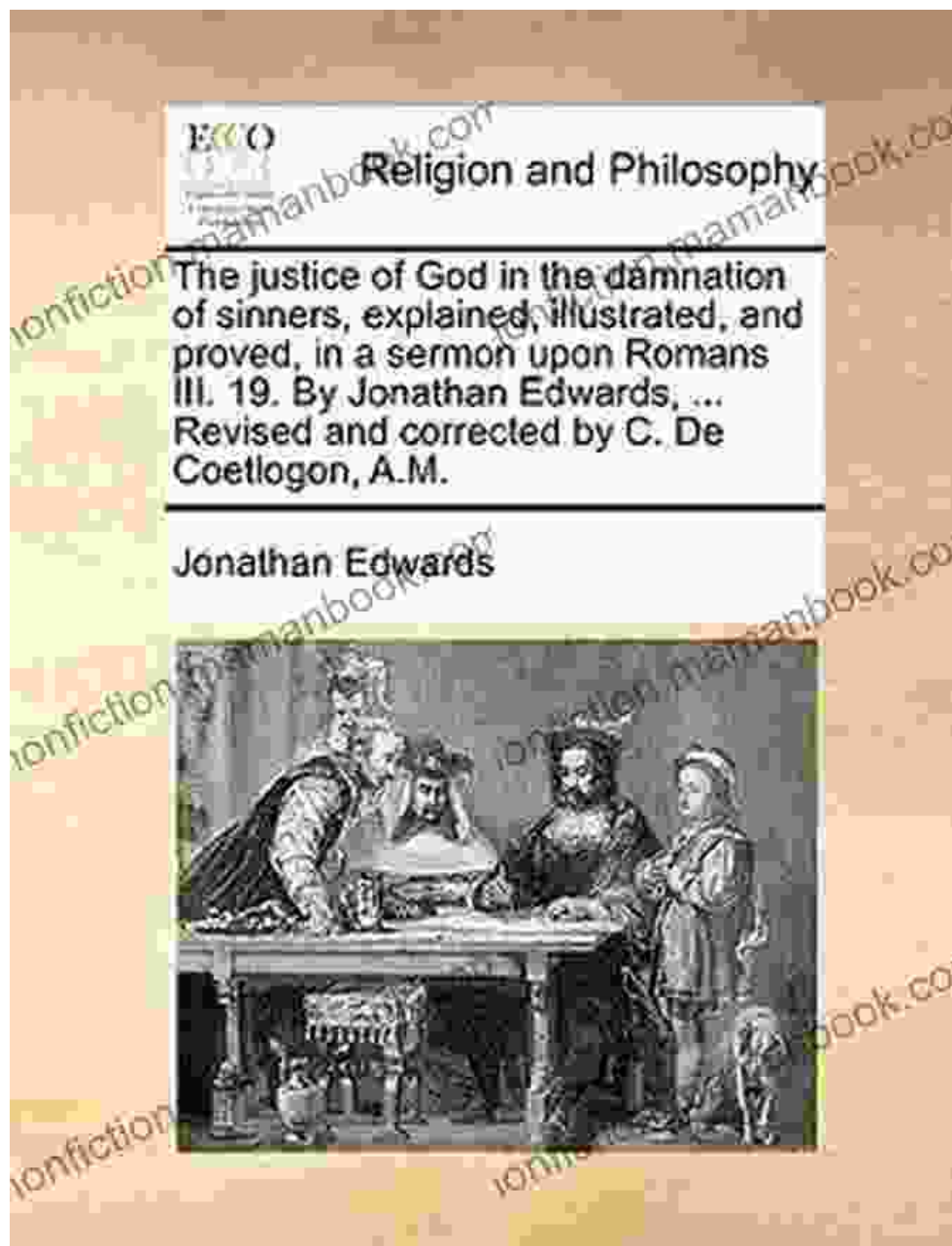

A depiction of the sermon 'The Nature of True Virtue' by Jonathan Edwards.

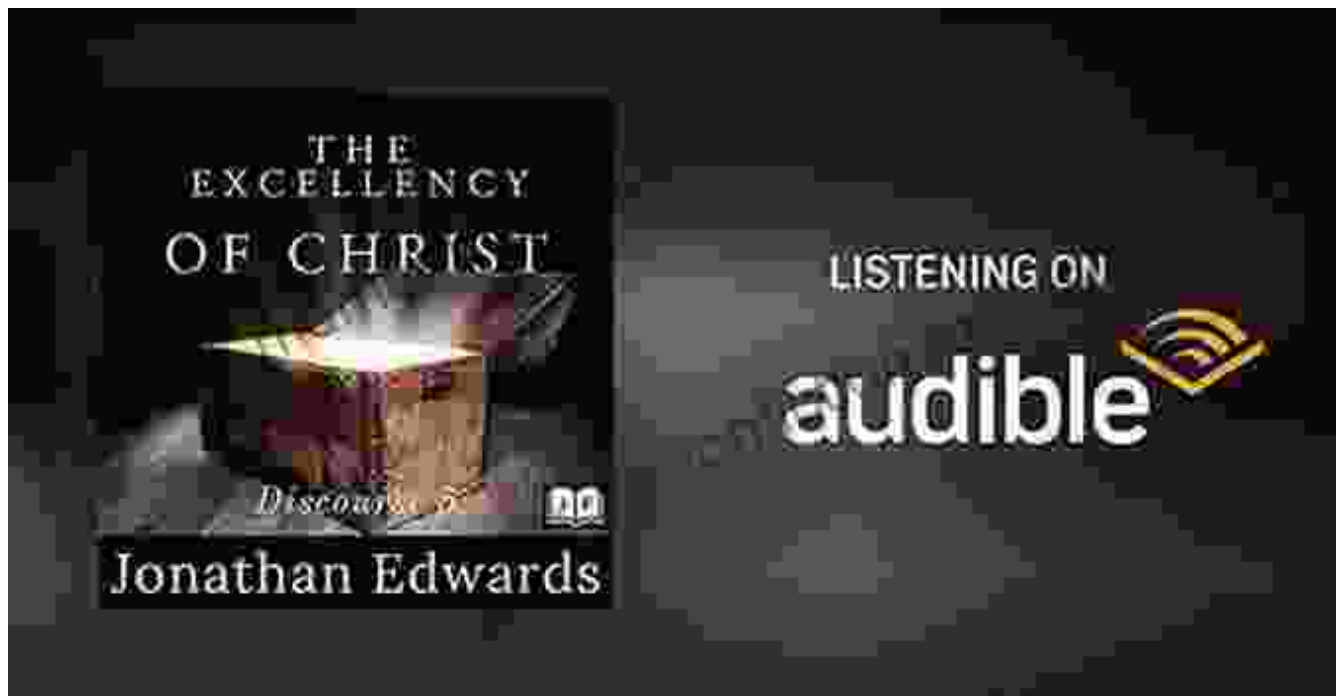

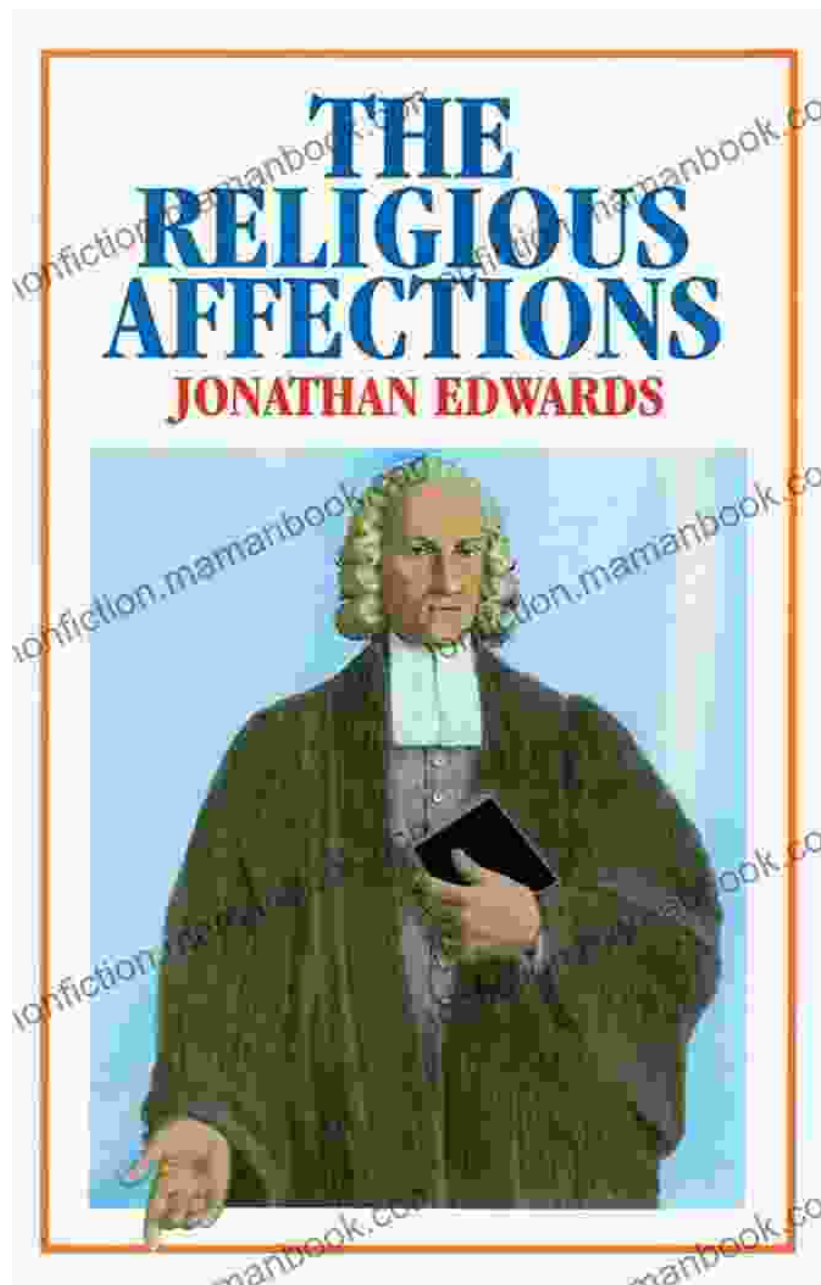
